Finally, on December 16th, 157 students from STA and Zohr participated in makeup exams across various fields, including logistics, industrial electronics, transformers, steel, IT, and pharmaceutical machinery.

In addition to these efforts, we conducted midterm and final examinations in logistics and warehousing for students from multiple institutions. A total of 51 B-Level students from STA2 and STA Sadat School, along with 22 C-Level students from STA Zohr, participated in these assessments. From September 3rd to September 10th, the practical examinations were hosted by DB Schenker, offering students invaluable hands-on experience and the chance to apply their knowledge in a professional environment.

AHK Egypt is proud to have been part of this prestigious event, which continues to shape the future of the industrial sector.






Past Event El Sewedy Technical Academy (STA) Graduation Ceremony




Past Event INNOVET Partnerships driving TVET Forward

Success rates for the final exams conducted this year reflect the hard work and dedication of our students and instructors.

Across all schools and sectors, the average total success rate was calculated, highlighting key achievements in individual sectors: Mechanics and Steel sectors achieved 78.72%, ICT recorded an impressive 85.93%, Electric and Electronics students achieved 63.81%, and Health Industries students reached 73.57%. Logistics students led the pack with an outstanding 86.93%, while Automotive students followed with 69.31%. These results showcase the exceptional quality of education and training across all programs.




Past Event Fayoum Annual Staff Trip



Inclusion of Marginalized Groups in Vocational Training Programs


- -How to improve access to vocational training for women, youth, and vulnerable groups.
